
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Academic Tutoring Center Update

- Provides one-on-one instructional support based on an individualized learning path developed from student's MAP profile, grades, reading level, and school and parent input.
- Currently has about 40 students rostered and serving 20 students regularly each week in grades 1-10 (available to serve K-12)
- Eight people currently serve students at the center, including current staff, retired teachers, and college students
- 2023 Spring MAP data demonstrated that students who are consistently attending the center grow an average of 10.9 points or 4.8 percentiles in Reading and 13.5 points or 8.7 percentiles in Math
- Summer hours will be 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Thursday beginning May 31st through June 23rd and will reopen after district shutdown (Week of July 4th)
