


ELA Highlights



Happening in FSD3

- District Instructional Team- have started weekly school instructional visits/walk-throughs using the Eleot Tool for Cognia review.
- Mrs. Dorris is working with Leadership Teams in data meetings:
 - All schools- analyzing iReady data and how to use the Rally Tool: Navigator Training to see historical data and help schools with data driven instructional moves.
 - <u>Secondary schools-</u> tracking Grad Rate & CCR-making in corrections to the data before final ratings are released.
