



 - LCHS- Increase Grad Rate to 70% and Increase Student Achievement in CORE subjects aligned to End of Course (Eng 2; Alg 1; Biology 1; US History
- Additional Funding:
 - JPT- \$95,000
 - LCHS- \$100,000
- Each school completed a self assessment using the Continuous
 Improvement Cycle Rubric- looking at systems and procedures for growth
