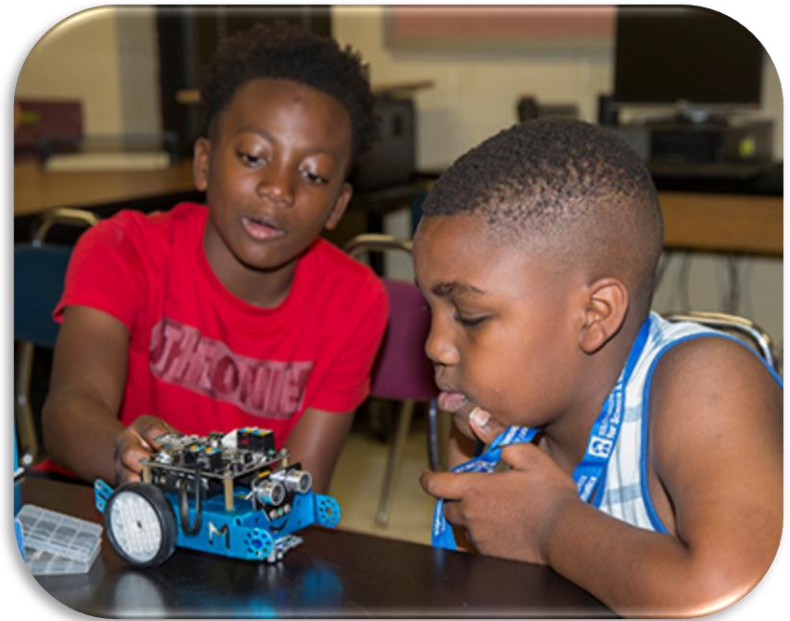

Addition to Student in Good Standing for Athletics

- A student must participate in prescribed remedial and/or tutorial program of academic assistance or activities if identified during any point of the active season. The identified student will be given a remediation program approved by the school principal and athletic director. This must be signed by the player, parent/guardian and coach/sponsor. The remediation program will include a minimum of extra tutoring time and weekly grade monitoring by the coach/sponsor. If a student is not passing the class at the interim, he/she is suspended from all activities until the grade rises above passing. At the end of a nine-week interval, this is an automatic two-week suspension. **If the student at report card time is failing two or more classes, he/she is immediately ineligible until the next report card period.**



Policy Revision - IKAB

Adding the following under Credit Recovery:

“According to the SC Uniform Grading Policy, if a student passes the credit recovery course with a 60 or higher, the passing grade is entered as a “P” as the final grade and transcribed to the numerical grade value of “0” as indicated by the addition of the “P” to the grade scale chart. If a student fails the credit recovery course with a grade below a 60, the grade is entered as an “NP” and transcribed to the numerical grade value of “0” as indicated by the addition of “NP” to the grade scale chart. Thus, the credit recovery course does not impact the student’s GPA. 4. A student wishing to modify his or her GPA shall repeat the full course for credit and not seek a credit recovery solution.”
