





Legislative Updates

- There is a proposed bill (<u>S.935</u>) to provide funding for public school students to pay for private schools or courses online. The bill will be taken up by a Senate Education Subcommittee.
- According to the <u>fiscal impact of the bill</u>, the program could cost public schools and the state **\$2.9 billion** by the fifth year if passed.
- The House Education Committee will pick up where they left off at the end of the 2021 session by taking up some K12 bills that passed out of subcommittee near the end of the session last year.
 - 1. A bill that requires high school students, beginning with students entering grade 11 beginning in the 2023-2024 school year, to complete a one-half credit course in basic personal finance as a graduation requirement in place of the existing economics course.



Legislative Updates

- 2. Bill, <u>S. 945</u>, would require school districts to livestream meetings of their school board by July 1, 2023;
- 3. Bill, <u>S.982</u>, would mandate districts to provide training and instructional materials to promote diversity, equity and inclusion on its website and prohibit districts or schools to mandate that students, teachers or staff participate in certain political events;
- 4. Bill, <u>S.970</u>, would direct the state superintendent to require the display of the national motto, the national flag and the state flag in every public school.



Legislative Updates

- 5. Bill, <u>H.3100</u>, directs that all fines collected from citing drivers unlawfully passing a stopped school bus to be used to purchase digital recording devices mounted on school buses and extended school bus stop arms.
- 6. The House passed a bill allowing schools to have up to 25percent noncertified teachers (<u>H.3590</u>) which will now go to the Senate Education Subcommittee. The bill is part of an effort to help schools address the teacher shortage.



- Current Fund Balance: \$8,383,421.00
- Requested use of Fund Balance: \$950,000.00
- Balance: \$7,433,421 (Which is 27% of the total GF expenditures)
- Our operational budget for 3 months is \$6,962,178.50.
- Moving the requested funds to our general funds will not exceed our 3 months of operational budget.

COVID Testing Sites

- We currently partner with The Pharmacy in Florence for employee COVID testing.
- Also, beginning January 24, 2022, FSD3 will offer Free COVID-19 testing at Lake City High School on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. This drive-up event will be in the parking lot behind the school. Participants will enter on the road between the gym and track. The hours of operation will be 9 -4 pm as long as the school is in session.
- This is for students and staff only. Advanced registration is required.
- We are also working on setting up a weekend COVID vaccination site.



eLearning Day Friday

- Florence School District 3 has designated Friday, January 21, a district-wide e-learning day for students due to the forecast for inclement weather. Students will be given assignments from their assigned school to complete from home and submit in within five days. Students and staff will return on Monday, January 24.
- Our food service staff will distribute a meal bag for all students at the end of the school day on Thursday, January 20, 2022.
