

Request to move funds from Fund Balance: Action Needed

• Current Fund Balance: \$8,383,421.00

• Requested use of Fund Balance: \$950,000.00

• Balance: \$7,433,421 (Which is 27% of the total GF expenditures)

• Our operational budget for 3 months is \$6,962,178.50.

• Moving the requested funds to our general funds will not exceed our 3 months of operational budget.

Request to move \$950,000 from Fund Balance to cover the following request.	Amount Requested /Used	Timeline
Employee appreciation/retention bonus	\$573,497	Completed December
Supplement donor funds (Larch Funds) to upgrade needed band supplies and equipment.	\$50,000	
Use funds to purchase supplies, materials, and uniforms for our chorus /ensemble.	\$50,000	
Research potential housing or a plan to support staff who travel more than 65 miles per day round trip to work. This could help with recruitment and retention.	\$226,503 *I would recommend a committee research details, housing cost in the area, sustainability overtime (upkeep, taxes, insurance, etc)	
Upgrade Athletic Facilities such as new bleachers; Weight Room Improvements	\$100,000

Legislative Updates

Actions on the Senate Floor

• <u>S. 946</u> – <u>Unencumbered Time for Elementary Teachers</u> – This bill directs elementary school principals to provide at least 30 minutes of unencumbered time to classroom teachers during each regular school day. Additionally, the bill directs a principal of any elementary, middle, or high school to provide at least 30 minutes of unencumbered time to teachers

Action: The bill received second reading by a vote of 41 to 0 on Wednesday and third reading on Thursday. The bill now moves to the House for consideration.

• <u>S. 203</u> – Removal of School Board Trustee – The bill adds school board members to the existing law authorizing the governor, rather than a county board, to remove public officials who willfully commit or engage in an act of malfeasance, misfeasance, absenteeism, conflicts of interest, misconduct, persistent neglect of duty in office or is deemed incompetent or incapacitated. The governor must notify the board member and provide the member an opportunity to be heard.

Action: The Senate insisted on its amendment so the bill will move to a conference committee. The House appointed Representatives Felder, Brittain, and Alexander.



Legislative Updates

• <u>H. 4766</u> – Coordinating Council for Workforce Development – This bill combines the EEDA Coordinating Council with the Coordinating Council for Workforce Development, eliminates designees, and outlines the specific duties of the Council.

Action: The Senate received the bill and assigned it to the Committee on Labor, Commerce, and Industry.



COVID Testing —Test To Stay

- We still partner with The Pharmacy in Florence for employee COVID testing.
- FSD3 also offers Free COVID-19 testing at Lake City High School five days per week now - Mondays - Fridays. This drive-up event will be in the parking lot behind the school. Participants will enter on the road between the gym and track. The hours of operation will be 9 -4 pm as long as the school is in session.
- Advanced registration is encouraged.
- We are also working on setting up a weekend COVID vaccination site.
