- Payout will be based on SC Ready scores.





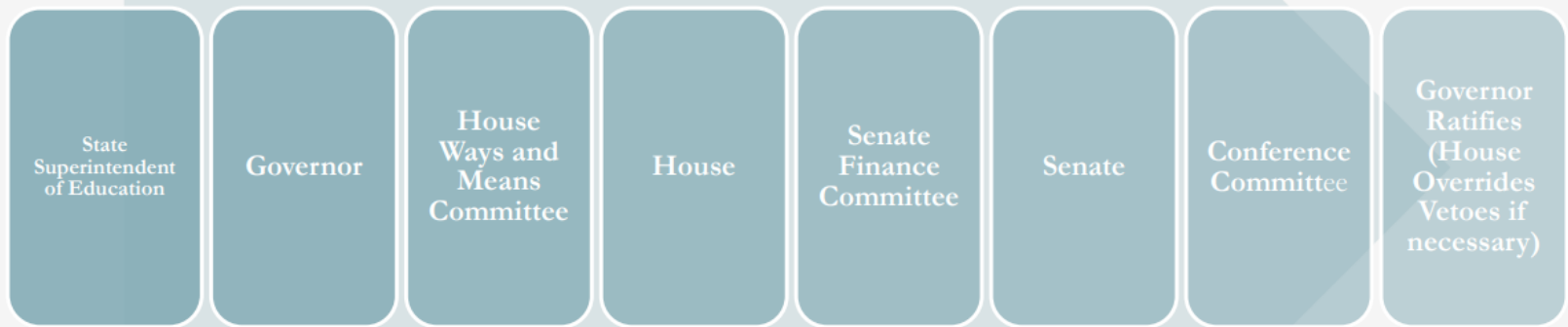

Funding Differences

Item – General Fund	House	Senate

House Floor Actions

H.3858 – Water Property Tax

- Bill reduces watercraft property taxes from 10% to 6%. The reduction is to be phased in over a three-year period beginning with property tax years after 2026.
- Signed into law by Governor.

House Floor Debate

- H.3831 – Smart Heart Act

- Bill mandates the development and implementation of Cardiac Emergency Response Plans and expands existing Automated External Defibrillator requirements in schools.
- Schools must ensure that an AED:
 - Is accessible for each on-campus athletic venue;
 - Is located in an unlocked and properly marked locations; and
 - Is accessible during the school day and during school sponsored athletic events or practices.
- State Fiscal Accountability Authority may establish a state contract for AED purchases, and the SCDE must pursue public and private funding sources to assist with implementation of the requirements of this bill.
- Signed into law by Governor.

Senate Education Committee

- [H.3195 Physical Education & Recess](#)
 - Seeks to increase instructional time in physical education courses and require mandatory unstructured, self directed recess for students in 4K – 8th grade beginning with the 2027-2028 SY
 - Schools must provide:
 - Minimum of 20 minutes of unstructured outdoor recess daily for 4K – 8th grade
 - One hour and 30 minutes of PE weekly for students in 4K – 5th
 - At least 60 hours of PE annually for students in grades 6th-8th.
 - Moves to the Senate calendar for future consideration

Senate Education Committee

- [H.3258 Mobile Panic Alert System](#)
 - Mandates school districts implement a mobile panic alert system in every school by July 1, 2028
 - Specifics that the panic alert systems must connect with existing emergency series technology to allow real-time coordination between schools, law enforcement and first responders. System must also integrate with local 911 public safety answering points so alerts and emergency calls can be transmitted directly to dispatch centers.
 - List of approved vendors will be published
 - Bill does not contain “subject to funding” language stipulating that the General Assembly would be required to provide funding for this mandate// funds falls completely on districts
 - Moved to the full Senate for discussion

Ways & Means Subcommittees

- [H.4611 – Paid Parental Leave](#)
 - Clarifies that eligible employees experiencing a still birth are entitled to paid parental leave.
 - Increases paid leave for birth parents to 12 weeks,
 - Increases paid leave for non-birth parents to 6 weeks,
 - Adds language clarifying that a still birth is a qualifying event.
 - Maintains the expansion of the definition of an eligible state employee.
 - Approved by committee

House Education Committee

- [H.3197 – Workforce Readiness](#)
 - High schools required to offer academic remediation in literacy and math for seniors who are not college ready
 - Graduation requirements to complete a FASFA form and must be completed at their annual Individual Graduation Plan (IGP)
 - Favorable and now moves to the House calendar for further discussion

Senate Floor Debate

- [H.4756 – Student Physical Privacy Act](#)
 - Multi-occupancy public school and higher education institution restrooms and changing facilities must be designated for use only by members of one sex and are to be used by members of that biological sex.
 - Bill moves to the House for approval

Provisos from Senate

Proviso - 1.39 (SDE: Health Education)

- This proviso directs school districts to fulfill all requirements of the Comprehensive Health Education Act and not violate any portion of the law.
- Each school is required to provide evidence of compliance to its school district, which must annually provide evidence of compliance for its schools to the S.C. Department of Education (SCDE).
- SCDE is authorized to review all materials used by school districts and provide oversight of a district's compliance report to make a final determination of compliance.
- The amount of state funding that may be withheld from a noncompliant district was increased from 1 percent to 10 percent.
- Adopted



New Bill in House

- **H.5483 – Educator Safety & Classroom Authority Act of 2026 (Introduced 4-1-2026)**
 - Seeks to protect educators, staff, and administrators, and enhance school discipline.
 - Grants authority for staff to use "reasonable physical force" for safety and to manage student behavior.
 - Implements procedures for removing disruptive students from the classroom.
 - Tasks the State Board of Education with creating a statewide classroom management framework

Phase 1B – Lake City Early Childhood Center

- Building Automation and mechanical punch list are completed.
- Substantial Completion has been achieved. Client handoff meeting with Schneider Electric is scheduled for April 21.

Fire Alarm Upgrades

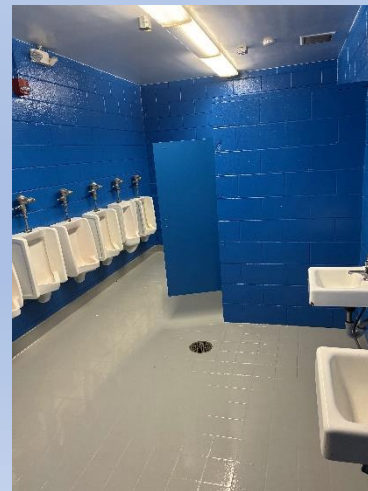
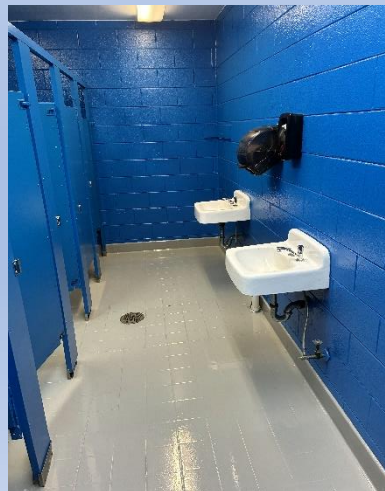
- Contractor is installing conduit at LCECC – approx. 60% complete.

MSE Gym Bard Units

- Contractor replaced 4 BARD units over spring break.

Painting Projects

- Bathrooms at LCHS were completed over spring break. Painting is underway at JPT, DREM, SESA and JCL and should be completed by end of May.



District Modernization Project with Schneider Electric

- We received \$20,782.65 in HVAC rebates from Duke Energy. This is the final rebate for our Phase II project at the Lake City Early Childhood Center. Added to the lighting rebate of \$12,507.64 already received, the total for this phase is \$33,289.29.
- Roof work at Main Street Elementary gym is complete except for gutters, which are being manufactured now.
- Submeters have been installed at Olanta, J.C. Lynch and Scranton; building automation continues.
- Mechanical permits are approved; window (LCHS, OMS) and lighting permits are still pending.
- Installation of ballistic film was completed over spring break.

Roofing, electrical, automation, lighting, permitting, and security upgrades are progressing districtwide, with Phase 1B handoff planned for late April.

Ward Memorial Stadium

- Soil compaction test was conducted on the building pad for the fieldhouse after unsuitable soil was replaced. The new pad passed the second test.
- Scoreboard has been mounted.
- Old press box on visitors side has been removed. A fence and rail will be installed place of the press box.
- Plumbing for the fieldhouse is expected to begin this week.
- Main water and sewer lines have been installed.
