LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

There are only a few days left in the 2023 legislative session, and currently, the General Assembly has not adopted a FY 2023-24 state spending plan, which needs to be in place July 1 for the beginning of the new fiscal year.



Custodial Services

Congratulations again to MSE on being named a Light House School. The process included an application process with lots of documentation and outside Evaluators visiting the school. To prepare for the visit and to ensure the school cleaned and sanitized for normal operations, I had to bring in an outside cleaning company to handle do the work.

We currently have 7.5 vacant custodial positions. We have had several vacancies all school year. Salaries and benefits ranged from \$24,000 up to \$35,358. (Total cost for vacant positions is about \$225,000 which would go toward contract services.)

Vacancies

To ensure we have safe, clean buildings, we will contract with an outside cleaning agency to help the remainder of the school year and this summer to ensure schools are deep cleaned for the new school year. Because this service may be needed long-term, an Invitation for Bids was published on the SC Procurement website. We received bids from 5 cleaning companies: CMA Services, Interstate, Defender Services, Carolina Surface Restoration and HES Facilities Management.

CMA Services won the bid. The plan is to contract three schools for the new school year as a pilot: JPT, JCL, and MSE.

We will shift current custodians where we have vacancies to create a full staff at all of our other schools.

We will evaluate the effectiveness of this throughout the SY, and I will keep you informed of the progress.



Secondary Panther Academy

- On Monday, May 1, 2023, a team visited the Academy of Success, Chapin SC – Lexington School District. The attendees were me, the staff from Panther Academy – Ms. Brown, Mrs. Moore, Mr. State, Mrs. Johnson, Mr. Maddox, Mr. Lloyd, Mr. Blake, Board member Mrs. Robinson, and Board Vice-Chair, Mr. Jac'kel Brown.
- The team had a great visit, and the information we received was informative. We will meet next week to discuss take-a-aways from the visitation and how we could set up a similar program that builds upon the current success of our alternative school Panther Pride.


