Legislative Updates

- A new state spending plan for FY 2022-2023 was adopted Friday which districts will receive funding through a new funding model, and the state minimum teacher salary schedule will increase by \$4,000.
- \$273.5 million for State Aid to Classrooms and increase to teacher salary schedule
- \$2.2 million to increase the teacher supply stipends from \$275 to \$300.
- \$4.2 million for a 5 percent pay increase to the state bus driver salary schedule
- \$12 million for the lease/purchase of school buses.

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2022 Instructional & Safety Plans – Action Needed

- In the 2022-2023 school year, Florence School District Three will offer a five day per week face-to-face instructional model.
- Offer a virtual option for no more than 3% of students who have maintained an average of C or higher.
- The virtual option will be for students in grades 7 12 only.
- We will continue to review recommendations from both DHEC and the CDC in regards to the necessary safety precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- We will continue to educate our staff, students, and stakeholders with the most up-to-date guidance from DHEC and CDC such as hand washing and respiratory etiquette; provide appropriate cleaning protocols to maintain healthy facilities. Also, continue to closely monitor community transmission levels.
- Our plan also includes improving ventilation and air quality.
- We will continue to work with local health agencies which provide free COVID-19 testing for our faculty and students as necessary. Students with an IEP will receive appropriate accommodations based on the needs of the student.
- Homebound instruction will be provided based on the need.
- The district will continue to utilize input and feedback from all stakeholders to make the safest decisions possible to maintain the health and safety of our students and staff.
