Legislative Updates

Under legislation (H.4285) adopted by the General Assembly, lawmakers can return June 8-10, June 21-23, and June 29-30 to finalize the state budget and take up local bills and resolutions and conference committee reports on legislation that has passed both chambers.



FSD3 Received \$12,788,521 (ESSER III) Fund Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief


- On March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act was signed into law. The US
 Department of Education is providing an additional funds for the Elementary and
 Secondary Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER III Fund). These funds will be utilized to
 close the achievement gap and create a safe learning environment for our students.
- We must develop a "Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan".
- We must involve stakeholders by asking our parents, staff and other stakeholders for input. The input will be used to finalize the "Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan" and develop an expenditure plan that aligns with the plan.
- To gather data, we will place a survey on-line along with the Safe Return Plan and the 15 allowable categories under ESSER III.
- The survey will consist of questions to address two major parts:

Part 1 - Spending of ESSER III funds and Part 2 - A Safe Return to In-Person instruction.

- 4- Support school leaders and school needs
- 5- Ensure preparedness and coordination (system and procedures)
- 6-Training related to infectious disease
- 7- Purchase cleaning supplies to sanitize and clean schools
- 8- Planning and coordinating for long-term closures for education to continue
- 9- Purchase educational technology
- 10 Mental Health supports
- 11- Summer Learning
- 12- Learning Loss
- 13- Facilities
- 14- Indoor Air Quality
- 15 Other activities to ensure continuity of education and employment
