
WHAT:

Legislative Initiative

Proviso 1.103: To receive state funds allocated for State Aid to Classrooms, a school district shall implement a policy adopted by the State Board of Education that prohibits access to personal electronic communication devices by students during the school day. For purposes of this provision, a personal electronic communication device is considered to be a device not authorized for classroom use by a student, utilized to access the Internet, wi-fi, or cellular telephone signals.

What the Policy Does

- Restricts Cell Phone Usage throughout the day
- Gives students the freedom to focus during the school day

What the Policy Doesn't Do

- Ban Cell Phones on Campus
- Ban Cell Phones from being used as medical devices
- Proscribe local discipline policy relating to cell phone policy enforcement
- Turn individual teachers into cell phone police
